City of Cleveland Provides General Updates on Coronavirus (COVID-19) Protocols -Update #28

CLEVELAND – The City of Cleveland continues to take numerous precautions across multiple departments and divisions amid increasing cases of coronavirus (COVID-19). Mayor Frank G. 13 New Cases of Coronavirus in Cleveland

The Cleveland Department of Public Health has been notified of 13 more confirmed test results for coronavirus in residents of the city. **This brings the total to 216 confirmed cases in the City of Cleveland and two fatalities, ranging from less than one year to their 90's.** The new cases include males and females, whose ages range from their 20's to 80's. CDPH is working to identify any close contacts of these residents who would require testing or monitoring for symptoms of COVID-19.

As of today, there are more than 4,450 confirmed cases and 142 fatalities in the State of Ohio. There are 356,000 confirmed cases and 10,500 deaths in the United States.

In order to protect the individuals' privacy, the Cleveland Department of Public Health will not be releasing any additional demographic information related to any COVID-19 cases aside from age range and gender.

Updates to Divisions of Urban Forestry and Parking Facilities Effective April 13

- **Urban Forestry**

In order to adhere to social distancing guidelines, Urban Forestry crews will be split into two work shifts. Each crew has two workers, with 10 crews on the East Side and 10 crews on the West Side.

State required social distancing mandates:

- Urban Forestry crews will be split into two 6 and ½ hour work shifts (½ hour lunch break is included)
 - Monday through Friday 6:30 am – 1:30pm
 - Monday through Friday 1:30 pm – 8:30pm
- Crew members will be dispatched to worksites in separate vehicles; there will be one person per vehicle
- Each shift will have crews working on both the east and west sides of the City
- Employees will be paid for eight hours of work; however, employees who work the second shift will not be paid a shift differential

- **Parking**

- The Division of Parking Facilities is currently open from 5 am until 11 pm Monday—Friday. Operational hours will be changed to 5 am – 7 pm Monday –Friday.
- Over the last two weeks most vehicles are out of the garage by 7pm. Signage will be placed throughout the garage advising customers of the change in hours.
- Daily meter collections have experienced a reduction from filling an estimated 10 to 12 canisters a day to 2 to 3 per day. The Division of Parking Facilities will reduce meter collections to two days per week and meter service inspection and repair to two days per week.
- The Gateway garage is averaging about 400 cars per day, 320 of which are monthly customers, the remaining 80 are transient. Most transient customers

are out of the garage by 6 pm. In an effort to reduce operating expenses, the City will instruct the parking operator to staff the garage from 6am until 6:30pm, and continue to maintain security from 6pm until 6am.

Department of Public Utilities

As a reminder, the drinking water is safe. While business is operating as normal, the Public Utilities Building is closed to the public. Cleveland Water and Cleveland Public Power have temporarily stopped disconnection of residential services for non-payment. Cleveland Water customers should call 216-664-3130 and Cleveland Public Power customers should call 216-664-4600 for service restoration.

Cleveland Water Pollution Control (WPC) Customer Service lobby remains open to the public to purchase permits and review maps. The WPC office at 12302 Kirby Ave. is open 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Report emergencies 24/7 by calling (216) 664-2513.

To date:

- CPP has reconnected 74 total customers
- CWD has reconnected 677 total customers

Reminder: April Bulk Pick-Up Suspended

All bulk pick-up for the month of April is suspended until further notice. This also means no special bulk pick-ups. The City will provide notice when the service resumes.

Reminder: Economic Development Resources for Cleveland Businesses

Mayor Jackson announced that the City has established an emergency working capital fund in order to help maintain the business community. It includes up to \$10,000 loan, no fees, no interest or payments due until January 1, 2021, 1% interest thereafter and payments of \$150/month until repaid. Funds are limited, so applicants are encouraged to submit their applications as soon as possible. View the [summary](#) and [application](#) here.

The City previously introduced legislation which was passed by Cleveland City Council allowing for a six-month deferral of payments on economic development loans issued by the City. The program authorizes the Director of Economic Development to defer payment on most loans and to seek the consent of lenders on other loans. A six-month deferral will

relieve some of the debt burden on our borrowers, reducing costs to businesses, during the enforced closures to protect public health.
